

# The University of Nottingham



*The average garden snail would take 700 days travelling non-stop from London to Nottingham.*

Ideally located just 2 miles outside Nottingham and close to the M1 and Midland Mainline, University Park is beautifully placed within 330 acres of rolling parkland, with a mix of stunning architecture, traditional features and modern facilities.

## Accommodation

Dinner, bed and breakfast accommodation will be booked in one of three University Halls of Residence – Ancaster Hall, Cavendish Hall or Lenton and Wortley Hall.

The Halls of Residence are all located on the residential side of the campus amid 330 acres of parkland. The 15 minute walk to the hub of the event is through some of the wonderful grounds and gardens.

Each Hall offers a mix of en-suite or standard rooms. All rooms offer tea and coffee making facilities along with a selection of toiletries. A small fridge is available in each room and there are small kitchens available throughout the Halls.

## Facilities

### Food

All delegates will have free tea and coffee available in the Conference Exhibition Marquees. During the day there will be a selection of catering venues where delegates can purchase a selection of snacks, drinks and hot and cold meals. Coates Court Café offers traditional hot meals and is situated next to the Pope Building. Café @ Bio in the Biology building and the Cafés in the Exhibition Marquees will offer a selection of drinks and hot and cold snacks.

### Internet

There will be access to the cyber centre in the Pope building for delegates wishing to access the internet. Delegates staying in the Halls of Residence will also be able to access the internet in their bedrooms using their laptop and cable.

### Sport

The Sports Centre, Swimming Pool and Fitness Centre are located on the residential side of Campus. Delegates presenting their bedroom key or delegate badge will have free access to the Fitness Suite and Swimming pool should they feel energetic. Delegates wishing to book other facilities will need to contact the Sports Centre to arrange.

## Transport

Parking is limited on the University of Nottingham site so delegates are advised to use public transport where possible. ASE buses will provide a pick up and drop off service between hotels, halls, the campus and the railway station. Delegates using public transport should get the train to either Nottingham or Beeston station. Both stations have services to St Pancras (London) and other cities around the UK.

The University of Nottingham is just outside the city centre and is centrally located for all transport links. It is 5 miles from Junction 25 of the M1 and 17 miles from East Midlands Airport.

### Travelling from Nottingham Railway Station to the University

Once you arrive at the railway station you will need to get a bus or taxi to the University Campus. A taxi will cost you about £6.00 and a bus journey about £2.00.

The bus station is across the road from the train station and from there there are a number of buses that run alongside the Campus.

### Travelling from Beeston Railway Station to the University

Once you arrive at the railway station you have the option of walking to the Campus which will take you about 20 minutes. Otherwise you can get in a taxi which will cost about £5.00.
