Nature Detectives: environmental science for primary children



This is a superb new book published jointly by ASE and the Woodland Trust, the first in the Nature Detectives programme. It is a treasure trove of tried and tested practical environmental science activities suitable for children aged

4–11, in the classroom and outdoors, devised by renowned primary science writer and teacher Max de Bóo and beautifully illustrated by the Woodland Trust. Topics covered include trees, flowering plants, birds, butterflies and other creatures, ponds, trails, and planting a garden for wildlife. Activities can be stand-alone or be used as a series, e.g. a half term topic.

Each section contains photocopiable pages, free of copyright to the purchasing institution. As well as science, the book covers literacy, numeracy, ICT, geography, social and citizenship skills, PE, music, design and make, and history.

Throughout the book, teachers and children are encouraged to participate in recording Nature's Calendar on-line, as part of the Woodland Trust's Nature Detectives programme. Full details of this recording scheme, which feeds into the national phenology database, are included in the book, as is a full colour poster.

Remember the little yellow technicians' guides?

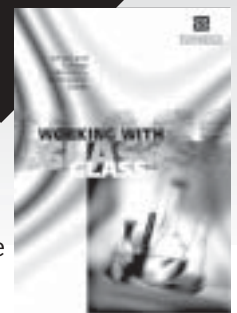
These books have been re-written by members of the ASE Technicians' Committee and the first two are out now!
